Short Term Priorities

- 1. Focus on social tennis and social activities this year by:
- Increasing committee focus and strength in this area
- Facilitated social sessions
- Roll out new buddy system
- Fun and competitive tournaments throughout the year
- Trialling a wide range of activities and encouraging membership support and involvement
- 2. Establish clear development routes for those joining the club and ensure focus to encourage people to come through
- 3. Address the membership categories and rights to establish simple fair and inclusive approach based primarily on peak vs non peak playing rights.
- 4. Articulate our family and junior offer and establish attractive terms to attract and keep juniors in the club, and their parents
- 5. Short term spruce up to clubhouse and other facilities
- 6. Significantly improve and focus on our online presence (website and Social media) the website is the window into our club
- 7. Developing numbers and targets to help us track progress

Test and innovate in 2022/23

Longer term Actions

- 1. Transform our RPLTC clubhouse into a welcoming thriving multi-activity hub, that is:
- An attractive place to spend time
- Is busy and well used throughout the year
- Offers a range of social ,leisure and sporting activities to our members
- Provides a high-class facility for our local community
- 2. Address our shortage of courts and add paddle boarding by:
- exploring all adjacent external capacity options with the Rugby club and Reigate college.
- Consider options in the carpark (with parking elsewhere)
- Review usage patterns post COVID to assess absolute need.
- Ultimately address the Grass court issue if demand and no other solutions found
- 3. Future proof the club and allow it to grow sustainably by:
- Transforming Clubhouse with low carbon heating/lighting
- Moving to LEDs for floodlights
- Installing electric charging points
